If you are not renewing, please let me know ASAP, as we are getting close to the cap of 60.

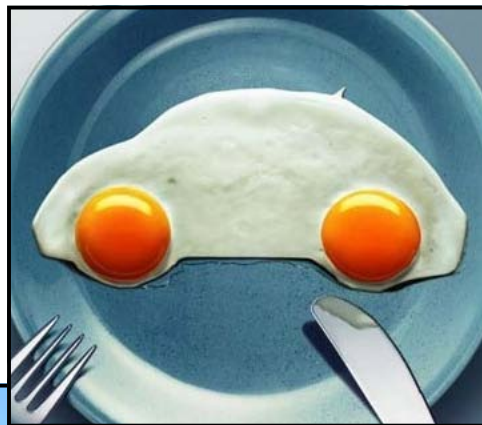
Also in the next financial year (1/7 to 30/6) you will be required to attend 2 club runs to maintain your membership.
